



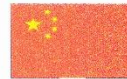

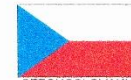

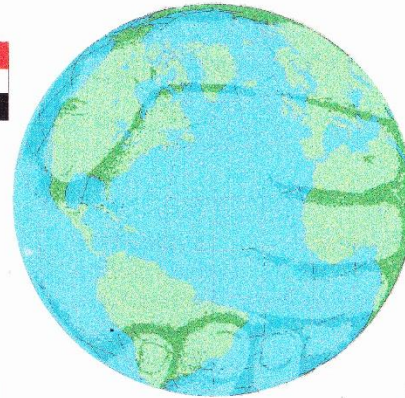

HOW IT ALL BEGAN

Our club is celebrating its 20th year of making friends with individuals across the world.

We began with 254 enthusiastic individuals on a mystery trip in a chartered plane, with a mission to be ambassadors of friendship to the people of another county. Only at the last moment did we find that the destination was Piacenza, Italy. Our group included a wide variety of occupations and ages, and some 60 members of the Haddonfield Symphony Orchestra and Chorale who had prepared a concert for our host community. We formed unforgettable relationships that participants remember vividly today.

The next day, a plane loaded with Italians disembarked here to be hosted by the South Jersey community.

All this transpired because of Wayne Smith, who first proposed establishing a worldwide citizen's exchange program to Jimmy Carter, then a presidential candidate. Friendship Force was launched from the White House early in Carter's presidency. Rosalynn Carter continues to serve as honorary chairperson.

On that first exchange, the emphasis was on flexibility. We went to live with people and share their lives, not as 'house guests' or 'tourists'. Some were hosted in mansions with servants...some peeled potatoes for the family restaurant...some lived on farms, where visits to 'mother' in the hospital was the concern...one couple with dietary problems were hosted by a hotel manager...a lawyer took a week off to play host and tour guide to another couple...one group found an empty apartment with a note on the door of the full refrigerator: "Help yourself, we went to New Jersey"...there were many stories.

A concert hall was expected by the orchestra and chorale. The venue was an outdoor stage in the ruins of an old manor house on the one day it rained. A Bechstein upright piano appeared from someone's home, a local harpist brought her instrument for loan (it was not taken out by mutual agreement). The concert went well, and the newspaper reviews were kind. (Piacenza is a sister city to Milan, home of the famous opera house, where music criticism can be an indoor sport.) In 1983, our Friendship Force Club was formed and from that beginning we have sent 590 ambassadors to 18 countries and hosted 958 ambassadors from 8 countries in return.

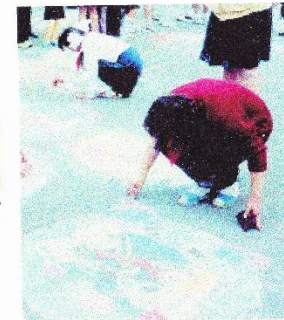
